- What Berries and Edible plants grow in your area?
- Ask your parents or google or check out a local edible plant field guide!
- Here in McCall Idaho we have Raspberries, Huckleberries, and Strawberries!

## **Step 3: Make your own Field Guide!**

- In a notebook, draw and label the edible berries that grow in your area!
- Add Pictures from googles or a field guide for future identification!

# Step 4: Use your Field Guide!

- Go on a walk in your area with your Field Guide and see what berries you can find!
- Here in McCall at Ponderosa state park you can find huckleberries and strawberries! See how many other berries you can find!
